Potential Discussion Questions Message: Know God - Just, pt 2 (6-17-18)

- 1. What do you consider our most pressing societal need for justice? Why?
- 2. How would you respond to a person who says God must not be just because there is so much injustice in the world? What did you learn from our 2 studies or other sources that helps you wrestle with this?
- 3. The outline lists lots of verses on justice, and you can find many more with a simple search. Read several and summarize what you think are the most important teachings. Does anything surprise or convict you?
- 4. Have you experienced a time when God's justice brought you comfort and hope? Explain what happened and how you were impacted.
- 5. Who do you consider the most vulnerable people around you? Does this study stir anything within your heart and desires for how to relate with them or intervene?
- 6. Is the biblical call to justice primarily a personal or corporate responsibility? What is the difference? Does it matter? Why?
- 7. How should a biblical view of justice impact our homes, our relationships, our politics? How could the world be helped with a biblical view of justice?
- 8. Take a couple of current injustices (like human slavery, racial inequities, immigration, etc.) and discuss how the biblical call to justice might impact you personally or public policy.
- 9. If there was some action step for you to take (or that you are taking) to live out biblical justice, what is it? What can you do in response this week?
- 10. What else would you like to discuss about this study on God's justice?
- 11. What is your best take-away from this study?
- 12. How can the group pray for you this week?
