Suggested Discussion Questions for 5/8/2022 Message: Groaning and Waiting (Romans 8:18-25)

- 1. When was a time that you endured a situation that involved groaning or waiting?
- 2. If present sufferings aren't worth comparing to the glories to be revealed, why do we tend to get caught up in and overwhelmed by them?
- 3. See if you can find some passages that describe "the glories to be revealed." How does that help you face the suffering and groaning in life?
- 4. How would you describe the past, present and future of the groaning of creation? Why is each aspect significant?
- 5. How does the revelation of a new heaven and new earth relate to God's overarching plan of redemption? When you read Rev. 21:1, Isa 65:17 and 66:22-23 and 2 Peter 3:10-13, what stands out to you?
- 6. Do you agree this passage gives us biblical insight in "earth care" or environmental issues? If so, what do you think it indicates?
- 7. How do you see groanings in life lifting your eyes to the goal of coming glory?
- 8. How do you see groaning and waiting inter-relating? How about groaning and hope?
- 9. What are some ways you have seen the benefit of waiting? How does it fuel our faith?
- 10. Respond to this statement: "Any believer who does not groan inwardly and wait eagerly for his or her adoption has a shallow understanding of the present condition and future hope God has provided for his children."
- 11. What would you like to discuss on this passage that hasn't been covered?
