- 1. If you knew you had only one more week to live, how do you think you would spend your remaining time?
- 2. Read John 12:12-36. The crowd shouts, "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the Name of the Lord!" What does this tell you about Israel's expectations for her Messiah (John 12:12-19)?
- 3. When the Galileans tried to make Jesus their king, He would not allow it (6:15). But here in chapter 12 He chooses to ride into Jerusalem publicly, and accepts the public acclaim. Why do you think He accepted the praise and recognition this time?
- 4. How do Jesus' declarations about His mission differ from the crowd's expectations (John 12:23-28)?
- 5. In His declarations, Jesus says that He is about to die. Looking at John 12:23-33, what could the people expect that Jesus' death would accomplish? (Especially John 12:23-24, 28, 31-32)
- 6. Which of these accomplishments of the death of Christ means the most to you, and why?

- 7. Jesus' last public message to His people is recorded in John 12:44-50. What parts of his message tell you that He is still lovingly reaching out to people who have rejected Him?
- 8. What are some ways in which you might follow the example of Jesus with people who reject you or refuse to listen to your testimony about Christ?
- Jesus said that this was the time for both Jesus and the Father to be glorified (12:23, 27-28). What particular events were about to glorify both the Father and the Son (12:24, 30-33)?
- 10. How could these things, which on the surface seemed to be nothing but defeat and humiliation, actually glorify the Father and the Son?
- 11. Read 12:24-26 again. Then restate these verses in your own words, using "I" and "My" to personalize it. Which part of these statements strikes you the most, and why?
